Subject: **RAIN-WIND/ THUNDERSHOWER IS PREDICTED IN UPPER/ CENTRAL PARTS
FROM 26TH SEPTEMBER to 01ST OCTOBER, 2024**

Dear Sir/ Madam,

I am directed to refer to the subject noted above and to state that Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD), Regional Met office, Peshawar predicted that moist currents from Bay of Bengal are likely to penetrate in upper parts from 25th September. A westerly wave is also likely to approach upper parts on 26th September.

Under the influence of these weather system:

- **Rain-wind/thundershower (with isolated heavy falls)** are expected in Chitral (Upper & Lower), Dir (Upper & Lower), Bajaur, Swat, Buner, Malakand, Shangla, Kohistan (Lower, Upper & Kolia Palas), Torghar, Battagram, Mansehra, Abbottabad, Haripur, Swabi, Mardan, Charsadda, Nowshera, Mohmand, Peshawar, Khyber, Karak, Kurram, Orakzai, Kohat districts from **26th September (evening/night) to 01st October**, while in Hangu, Lakki Marwat, South (Lower & Upper) & North Waziristan, Bannu, Tank and DI Khan districts from **27th September to 01st October** with occasional gaps.

Possible Impacts:

- **Heavy rains** may increase flow in local nullahs/streams in Galliyat, Mansehra, Abbottabad, Kohistan, Chitral, Dir, Swat, Shangla, Bajaur, Mohmand, Khyber, Nowshera, Swabi during the forecast period.
- **Landslides** may disrupt roads at the vulnerable points of Upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Galliyat during the forecast period.
- **Windstorm and lightning** may affect damage weak structures like roof/wall collapse of Kacha houses, electric poles, bill boards, vehicles and solar panels etc., during the forecast period.

It is therefore, requested to kindly take all precautionary measures in order to avoid/minimize human losses and/or any damages to property. Furthermore, all concerned authorities are requested to take following safety measures:

- Ensure availability of all emergency services staff/ machineries and other resources;
- Main/ linked roads shall be kept clear and open;
- Uninterrupted water supply shall be ensured;
- Ensure sufficient quantity of daily food and other commodities;
- Petrol pumps shall be kept functional with sufficient fuel availability for public;
- Ensure sufficient medicine stock in the hospitals;
- Local administrations to assess and plan deployment of additional resources and exercise control over traffic leading to and in vicinity of vulnerable/ choke points/ tourist spots/ attractions and securing (by physical means and keeping people away) from loose structure such as buildings under constructions, advertisement hoardings, electric poles, solar panels etc. to prevent losses / damages and save precious lives;
- Preplace necessary emergency equipment at vulnerable/ strategic locations to expedite response efforts and complete any stocking/ replenishment of stocks;
- Proactively maintain nullahs/ stormwater drains to ensure their proper functioning and prevent blockages that may lead to urban/ flash flooding;
- Ensure that drainage systems are clear of debris and obstacles to facilitates the efficient flow of water and minimize risk of urban/ flash flooding;
- NH&MP and Traffic Police to coordinate with Law Enforcement Agencies to manage traffic in affected areas to prevent congestion and facilitate emergency response efforts;
- Coordinates with relevant municipal administrations to ensure mitigation & preparedness measures for landslides/ flash flooding/ hill torrents and to secure or remove billboards/ hoardings in view of wind/dust/ thunderstorm and showers;



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- Forewarn travelers/ tourists about risks posed from flooding / landslides in vulnerable locations and provide guidance and assistance in case of emergencies through local administration, police and rescue services;
- Judicious use of water is requested from all aspects of life;
- General public is advised to avoid unnecessary exposure to direct sunlight and to seek shelter in safe areas such as sturdy buildings or underground structures during windstorm/ thunderstorm/ lighting and avoid objects that pose a risk of failing or being struck;
- Farmers to be advised to take all necessary mitigative and precautionary measures to safeguard their crops, i.e., manage the watering of crops, timely harvesting, safe storage or any other precaution during the spell;
- Ensure widespread circulation of alerts and advisories, especially in local languages, to raise awareness and sensitize travelers / tourists and local communities;
